How to write a mathematical paper that a journal will publish and other people will actually read?

In this course Prof. Iserles will address the entire range of considerations when planning and writing a paper: its motivation, structure, language, typesetting, choice of a journal, etc. He will also describe the standard model of mathematical publishing, as well as discussing new and alternative models, in particular Open Access.

The course will be divided into three sessions. In the first session, the participants will receive tips how to write a mathematical paper. In the second session, the participants will write their own text, which will be discussed in

the third session.
